

ABOUT THE SERVICE

Sun Shuttle Route 486 provides accessible transportation from Ajo to Tucson and points in between Monday through Friday. The one-way trip is approximately 130 miles, serving Ajo and Why on State Route 85, the Tohono O'odham Nation on State Route 86, Robles Junction (Three Points) and the Laos Transit Center in Tucson. At Laos, passengers can transfer to Sun Tran, Sun Express or other Sun Shuttle routes.

GREYHOUND CONNECT

Greyhound Connect is a service that connects rural communities to larger Greyhound markets in the United States. The Ajo to Tucson Route 486 offers a stop at the Greyhound terminal in Downtown Tucson for connections to Greyhound service to Phoenix and other U.S. cities. WAYS TO PAY & TRANSFER

Passengers must pay with cash to ride Sun Shuttle Route 486. Exact change is required.

HOW TO RIDE

1. We recommend you arrive at your designated stop at least 5 minutes early. Wait where the coach operator can see you.
2. Check the sign above the front windshield to be sure the shuttle travels to your desired destination.
3. Stand up but stay back from the curb until the vehicle comes to a complete stop.
4. Exact change is required..
5. When boarding, inform the driver where you would like to get off the bus.
6. Gather all personal belongings before you exit. If you have a bike stored in the bike rack, tell the driver you need to unload your bike. Sun Shuttle is not responsible for items left on the vehicle.
7. Passengers using an approved alternate boarding location should wait a safe distance from the street and wave to the driver indicating you want a ride.

RULES FOR RIDING

Be Safe and Respect Other Riders

- Shirt, pants and shoes are required.
- No smoking on board, including electronic cigarettes.
- Never interfere with the driver's ability to drive safely.
- Always keep arms, head and hands inside the vehicle.
- Gasoline-powered (GP) bicycles, GP scooters and GP skateboards are not allowed on vehicles or bike racks.
- Vehicle batteries and gas containers are not allowed inside transit vehicles.
- Except for service animals, keep pets enclosed in small cages or cardboard boxes.
- With the exception of approved alternate boarding locations, vehicles will stop only at designated stops.

Take Care of Your Bus

- Keep food and drinks in closed containers. No eating on the transit vehicle. No alcoholic beverages.
- Do not litter or create unsanitary conditions. Take your trash with you.
- Do not damage transit property.

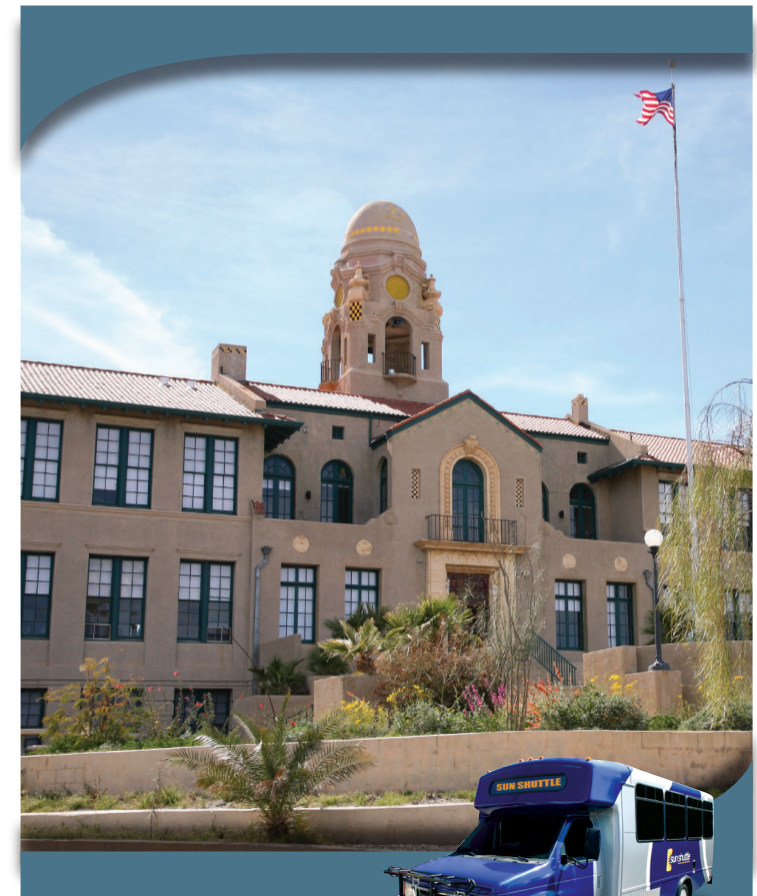
